The Review Panel will review and award the **CEA** programme with reference to the scale:

Program Hours from 1.5 hrs* to 4 hours - HK\$ 400 to HK\$900

Program Hours from 5 hours to 7 hours— HK\$ 1000 to HK\$1700

Program Hours with 8 hours or more –HK\$ 1800 to HK\$ 2000

*For programme lasting for 1.5 hours only, it must be conducted in one session within the same day.









Application Method



Interested residents may submit their application forms within the application period and at least two weeks before the first class of the proposed programme to hall edu@hkbu.edu.hk.



Criteria of Program

- 1. The programme must have a cultural element and open to all residents.
- 2. The programme must be conducted in English except for foreign language learning programs.
- 3. The minimum class size should be 10 which must include local, mainland and international students.
- 4. The programme host(s)/ hostess(es) may conduct their cultural projects individually or in group. The programme hours must not be less than 1.5 hours. For programme lasting for 1.5 hours only, it must be conducted in one session within the same day.
- 5. The programme host(s)/ hostess(es) will design, promote, deliver and evaluate their own programme. By end of the programme, the programme host(s)/ hostess(es) will submit reports to the staff-in-charge of the Cultural Experience Award. The report must include attendance sheets, photos taken during the programme, programme host(s)/hostess(es) self-evaluation, peer evaluations from the participants and other necessary supporting documents.
- 6. Subject to the approval of the staff-in-charge of the Cultural Experience Award, the programme host(s)/ hostess(es) may request to collect a reasonable amount of programme fee from their participants, as material cost or other programme related expenses. Substantial proof should be presented to the staff-in-charge of the Cultural Experience Award for such request.







Selection Procedure and Criteria

- 1. The Selection Panel, composed of Resident Master or Assistant Director of Student Affairs and staff from the Hall Life Team, will be formed to assess the applications.
- 2. Only short-listed candidates will be invited to attend an interview. During the interview, the candidates will be required to present their programme objectives and lesson plans with or without other visual aids like powerpoint.
- 3. The recommendation of the Selection Panel will be submitted to the Director of Student Affairs for final approval.
- 4. Staff from Hall Life Team will monitor the implementation of the programme initiated by the successful candidate(s).
