# HONG KONG BAPTIST UNIVERSITY Undergraduate Halls, Student Accommodation Section, Office of Student Affairs General Information of Green Quest 2018-19 (城林綠影)

The Undergraduate Halls believe GREEN is a living style in striving for balance and aiming for economic, social, and environmental sustainability. Green Quest is an annual green program organized by the Undergraduate Halls to enhance green awareness of HKBU students through seminar series and overseas experiential tour.

#### I. Program Structure

## <u>Part 1: The Green Foundation- Seminar Series and Training</u> (<u>February 2019 - April 2019</u>)

- Local seminar series by professional speakers on issues like environmental problems, social issues, urban development and planning.
- Workshops to brainstorm on how the green effort could be enhanced in Hong Kong and at the HKBU.

# <u>Part 2: The Green Journey- Overseas Experiential Green and Cultural Tour</u> (20 May 2019 – 2 June 2019)

- Experiential Green and Cultural Tour to Denmark (Copenhagen) and Sweden (Malmö).
- Includes cultural tours, firm visits, field works and meetings with Scandinavian students and experts.
- Students will have hands-on experience and develop new understandings to how green initiatives could be implemented into everyday life, from the infrastructure and system, city planning, government policy to culture and lifestyle.
- Students will take away how sustainable thinking could be combined with economic and social factors under local context.

# Part 3: The Green Giving-Sharing Session (October 2019) Green Quester Program (2019-2020)

- After the Green Journey, students will share their experience and insights from the tour and pass the green message forward.
- Students will be invited to join the Green Quester which is a team of past Green Quest participants working to deliver green programs in the Undergraduate Halls.

#### II. Program Fee

- (1) Green Foundation Seminars (Part 1 ONLY): Free- of- charge and recognized as CCL program.
- (2) FULL Green Quest program (Part 1 to Part 3): <refers to *IV. Important Timeline* for payment details>
  - (i) **Program Fee:** \$9,880 (includes \$3,000 as Non-Refundable Program Fee Advance Payment)
  - Program Fee includes round trip airfare, airport tax & fuel surcharge, group insurance, all travel expenses in Denmark and Sweden and TWO of the group dinners.
  - Other beverage and food and any other expenses incurred out of the itinerary as designed by the Undergraduate Halls, are to be borne by the participants.
  - Program fees are estimates only and are subject to change, depending on the exchange rate.
  - Mainland and Overseas Expedition Fund (MOEF) is a subsidy to sponsors students to mainland and overseas expeditions organized by the Office of Student Affairs (SA). Eligible participants will be automatically included to the scheme and the subsidy will be used to cover the cost of the individual awardees. The listed program fee (\$9,880) takes into account subsidy from MOEF. If the student is sponsored by MOEF in other programs organized by SA, please contact the organizer for the program fee that applies.
  - Eligible participants under this program may apply for HKSAR Reaching Out Award (ROA) to cover the cost of the individual awardee in the program. To avoid double benefit, if the participant is eligible to both ROA and the abovementioned MOEF, subsidy from ROA will be deducted from the cost of program prior to the consideration of Mainland and Overseas Expedition Fund (MOEF).
  - Any excess in program fees will be refunded after the program.

#### (ii) Refundable deposit \$1,000

• Refundable to participants attended at least two out of three seminars AND the predeparture training session.

#### III. Application Details

- (1) Eligibility: Open to all degree seeking UGC funded Undergraduate students at HKBU.
- (2) Application: Submit the completed Application Form on or before 13 November 2018 (2pm). Please specify on the email subject "Application to Green Quest".
- (3) Assessment: Short-listed candidates will be invited to attend an interview.
