### **Enhancing Student Participation**

In recent years, various student organizations have dissolved, resulting in students losing their channels for expressing opinions. This has led to university policies failing to adequately address student needs. Students also lack familiarity with the operations of the Senate and whom to approach with their concerns. If I am elected, I will focus on explaining the operations to fellow students, ensuring that they understand who to approach when issues arise. I will also work diligently to strengthen communication between the university administration and students, actively relaying student feedback, and increasing student participation in university governance.

#### **Bolstering Student Influence**

Currently, the Senate lacks sufficient transparency, leaving students uninformed about the latest developments in university policies and administrative directions. I aim to enhance transparency by enabling student participation in governance. I will closely monitor all decision-making processes in the Senate and provide regular updates to students about the information therein. Additionally, I will maintain active communication with other student representatives to strengthen our collective influence in decision-making, ensuring that student voice is heard.

### Regarding Advisor Allocation in the School of Communication

The School of Communication currently implements a broad-based admission system, where students select their majors after the first semester of their first year. During this selection period, students are assigned academic advisors to consult about their major choices. However, faculty members from the Department of Interactive Media are also being assigned to advise students who are going to choose Journalism and Digital Media or Public Relations and Advertising Major. I hope to follow up on the advisor allocation issue to ensure proper resource distribution and enable students to receive the most appropriate guidance before making their major selection.

#### **Regarding Cafeteria Issues**

During operating hours, external individuals can freely enter the campus. Particularly during lunchtime, both construction workers and secondary school students gain unrestricted access to the school cafeterias. Despite existing notices addressing this issue, the problem persists regarding cafeteria facilities not being exclusively reserved for students and staff members. The excessive presence of external visitors during mealtimes interferes with students' class schedules. Therefore, I hope to continue bringing this matter to the administration's attention and explore more effective solutions.
