HKBU Student Volunteering Mobile

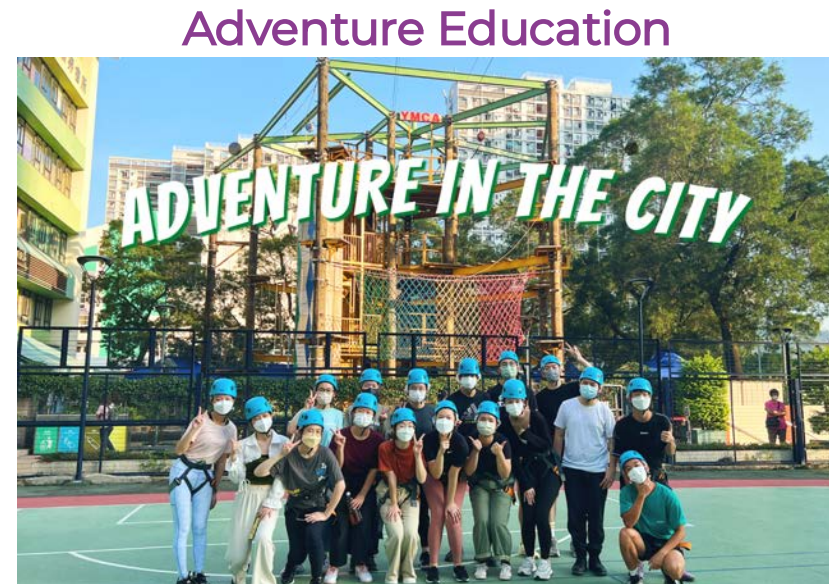

Highlights

Adventure Education



A group of HKBU students participated in a series of thrilling adventure activities offered by YM-ADVENTURE. They challenged a 3-meter high rope course with 7 elements, and the first "Lizard Wall" in Hong Kong, etc. During the adventure activity, students supported each other and encouraged teammates to be courageous though they met for the first time only. The cheering was heart-warming!

Co-Curricular Learning (CCL)



Mr. Vivek Mahbubani, a famous stand-up comedian in Hong Kong, came to HKBU to share the useful techniques of body language and storytelling skills of a comedian with around 80 students. Some students shared their ideas of developing career as a comedian to bring happiness and joy to audiences.

Community Engagement



After attending four letter counselling and Japanese Nagomi Pastel Art trainings, 11 HKBU students were successfully qualified as the volunteers of 'Uncle Long-leg' Letter Box. Students gained insights on children's developmental needs and the impacts of family on child growth. They also learnt basic Japanese Nagomi Pastel Art techniques and created 300 Christmas Cards to present their Christmas blessings to the children.

Two groups of HKBU students were equipped with balloon-making and story-telling skills after attending three training workshops. The students visited youth centres and performed services by twisting different cartoons and Christmas decorations during their story-telling.

15 HKBU students participated in Kayak Adventure and Marine Conservation for five consecutive Saturdays. After attending all three training sessions, they obtained "Kayak 3-stars" award from Hong Kong Canoe Union and they took part in the rubbish collection in the sea and different outlying islands in Hong Kong.

46 students in eight groups from the course GCAP 3067 designed and organised a variety of activities to address diverse needs of 40 elderly people. During the session, the elderly got the chance to make herbal sachets, experience meditation, learn about the profound history of Chinese Medicine, and more.
