Through these two programmes, LQC collaborated with students, aiming to serve diverse segments of the community, fostering compassion and support.



Community Engagement Organisers: Positive Ageing Learners Programme (CEOs-PAL)

The Community Engagement Organisers: Positive Ageing Learners Programme (CEOs-PAL), supported by The Providence Foundation Limited since 2021, promotes lifelong learning through interactions between students and seniors. This initiative helps students deliver essential services to elderly residents in Wong Tai Sin, fostering intergenerational knowledge exchange and enhancing communication and problem-solving skills. Over six months, 60 students worked in groups to support more than 130 elderly individuals.



Community Service Day - Serve Tour-gather

At HKBU Community Service Day 2024, themed 'Serve Tour-gather,' students designed service projects for various groups, including the Visually Impaired, Physically Handicapped, Lowincome Families, Ethnic Minorities, and the Elderly. These initiatives, shaped by local insights, helped students develop empathy and leadership skills, promoting active citizenship within the university. On the service day, 60 students created memorable experiences for over 230 participants.

Paper Blossoms: Seed Paper Pulp Making

This initiative combines creativity and sustainability. 19 participants took part in a hands-on workshop to master the craft of making plantable seed paper from recycled materials, allowing them to grow greenery from the paper. Additionally, some of the seed papers produced were donated to 70 underprivileged children & elderly, helping them bring a touch of nature into their homes.

Train the Trainers: DIY Mossart Workshop

Explore the intricacies of moss artistry to bring nature into your living spaces. 27 students shared their skills through community service projects, conveying ecoconscious messages to over 30 children and deepening their connection with the environment.

Community Walks to our Neighbourhood: Kai Tak New Develpment Area & Kowloon City

24 students explored our neighbourhood, led by town planners.

The Kai Tak New Development Area in Hong Kong transforms the former airport site into a vibrant residential and commercial hub. The Outline Zoning Plan focuses on creating a green, people-oriented space with low-carbon initiatives facing Victoria Harbour. The guided walking tour showcased key features like Kai Tak Station Square and the Cruise Terminal.

Mosaic Tiles (紙皮石) have transitioned from a construction material to a cultural symbol of Hong Kong's architecture. Their classic designs are now popular in various products and artworks. The guided tour explored the craftsmanship and cultural significance of these tiles in Kowloon City, highlighting the area's rich history and transformation.

Leadership & Character Enhancement Programme

Leadership and character building are essential components of whole-person development. To nurture future leaders equipped with professional knowledge and strong values, the Leadership Qualities Centre has launched the "Leadership & Character Enhancement Programme". This bespoke initiative invites university and secondary school students to embark on a journey toward excellence through professional training and engaging learning experiences.





4-Day Intensive Training



The first day of the training programme focused on fundamental leadership principles, followed by a workshop on effective communication skills. Participants engaged in activities to understand key leadership concepts and practiced communication techniques, laying a solid foundation for further development in both areas.





During the second and third days, participants explored Design Thinking, Event Planning, and Ethical Leadership. The agenda included workshops on social innovation, event design, and activities like the Group Survival Game for ethical decision-making. Students also dedicated time to prepare their final presentations, culminating in a Case Study on Ethical Selection to reinforce essential leadership skills.

Not the stand-out one is the only leader

During the 4-day training programme, **27 HKBU Peer Mentors** collaborated with **123 secondary student leaders** to develop a proposal for a fun fair tailored for individuals with special needs. The project emphasized effective role definition and the idea that leadership is about collective contributions, not individual prominence. Participants also created posters showcasing university life and academic settings, with Peer Mentors guiding students and ensuring the project's smooth execution.

Proposal design: Fun Fair for people with special needs

To foster empathy and civic engagement, the final project challenged students to design a fun fair for individuals with special needs. They created **9 comprehensive plans** that addressed the specific requirements of their target audience, promoting inclusivity in their designs.

Professional judges from NGOs were invited to provide practical feedback for students to reflect their learning and develop a higher sense of civic responsibility.



The programme aimed to achieve three objectives: improve students' leadership abilities in organising and implementing events, cultivate ethical values and virtuous traits, and equip students with the professional knowledge and practical skills needed for effective team management.

Common Good in Action (CGA)

The "Common Good in Action" (CGA) project encourages university students to tackle environmental and social issues, support neglected community groups, and promote a sustainable society through innovative approaches. Participants can enhance their personal skills and implement self-initiated projects in Hong Kong or beyond, supported by awarded subsidies.

Students can choose between a local or non-local track based on their project scale. Here are some awarded projects for Semester 1, 24–25:

During the Ethnic Minority Inclusion Programme, students invited a social worker from Christian Action (基督教勵行會) to provide information about disadvantaged and marginalized groups in Hong Kong and to share the challenges they face.

Catalyst for Community Building Grant (CCB)

The grant encourages integration and community building of local and non-local students by awarding financial support.to student-initiated local activities or outbound backpacker trips.

- Local activities Be the Host: Host an activity that encourages cultural exchange among at least 5 local and non-local students, with a subsidy of up to \$1,500 per activity.
- Outbound trips Backpacker: Travel with other HKBU students or independently, receiving a subsidy of up to \$2,100 per student. A bonus is available for students who host and showcase the specialties of their home country or province to other eligible HKBU students.

The Shanhai Jing, a revered Chinese classic, was the highlight of the "Moon Party: from Myth to Future," which explored archaeology, resources, medicine, beliefs, myths, and history from ancient times. Attracting over 1,600 attendees, the event offered a captivating journey through ancient, mythological, sci-fi, and imaginative realms.

More than 90 students played key roles in organising the two-day event, ensuring its success. Participants enjoyed a variety of activities, including sugar paintings, lantern riddles, mask-changing performances, Nanyin music, traditional Han clothing experiences, pitch-pot games, and a selection of festive foods and souvenirs.

Key attractions featured the "See MED Chinese Medicine" booth, Cantonese opera showcases, and Chinese ink painting sessions led by Art Technology students. Overall, the event provided a rich cultural experience, allowing attendees to immerse themselves in the diverse traditions and heritage of Chinese culture.



Micro Capture, Macro Insights

Transdisciplinary Projects

Rethinking Prejudice

Under the guidance of Ms. Idris Ho, students embarked on a captivating journey from the microscopic to the macroscopic.

Engaged in hands-on micro photography that challenged their perceptions and reveals hidden truths, students learned to apply these insights to everyday life, gaining a fresh appreciation for the extraordinary within the ordinary.

In a 12-hour workshop for the Year 2 Human Behaviour and Diversity class of 45 students, the transformative power of music and video was used to challenge prejudice and explore complex human experiences.

The workshop facilitated inclusive dialogues on vital topics such as mental health, disabilities, gender and sexual orientation, age differences, new immigrants, and ethnic discrimination. By leveraging music and video, participants engaged deeply with these themes, fostering understanding and empathy while appreciating the richness of human diversity.
