MY JOURNEY AT THE GLOBAL PEACE SUMMIT

My scepticism proved unfounded, as the Summit exceeded all expectations. With newfound determination and a network of allies spanning the globe, I am confident in our ability to make a difference.

Now, I serve on the Youth Organizing Committee, planning the 4th edition of The Global Peace Summit 2025.

RENOWNED SPEAKERS



ACROSS RED LINES

In times of war, survival often overshadows everything, including personal rights. For Dr. Manal Omar, this stark reality sparked a call to action. As a humanitarian and human rights activist, Dr Omar stands as a beacon of hope for women in conflict zones. Through her organization, Across Red Lines, she creates safe spaces for Muslim women to explore their leadership and inner strength.

Dr Omar's journey began in the tumultuous regions of Iraq, North Africa, and Iran. Her work with the United States Institute of Peace exposed her to the profound struggles faced by women in these areas, where women's rights, civil society, and identity were under constant threat. Inspired by these experiences, she began writing about the lives of aid workers and the fight for women's rights, with her stories featured in major publications such as the LA Times and BBC.

Named among the Top 500 World's Most Influential Arabs by Arabian Business in 2011 and 2012, Dr Omar's impact extends far beyond accolades. Through Across Red Lines, she empowers Muslim women to harness their strength and drive change, even in the most challenging circumstances, embodying resilience and the transformative power of advocacy for human rights.



UNIMAGINABLE HORROR

At just 12 years old, Antoinette Mutabazi faced unimaginable horror: finding her six-year-old brother wounded and pleading for water. During the 100 days of terror that followed, she lost her mother, two young brothers, and dozens of relatives, all murdered because they were different. Antoinette is a child survivor of the Rwandan Genocide, where the Hutus targeted the Tutsis in a horrific wave of violence. As a young girl, she dreamed of becoming a doctor. However, the eruption of conflict left her wishing to be anything but human, overwhelmed by the brutality she witnessed.

Despite the deep scars of her past, Antoinette has emerged as a powerful advocate for forgiveness and peace. She courageously shares her story, no matter how painful, to raise awareness about the struggles of refugees and asylum seekers. Her voice has become a beacon of hope, emphasizing the power of forgiveness as a path to healing and reconciliation.

Today, Antoinette Mutabazi is actively engaged with Youth With A Mission, dedicating her life to fostering peace and understanding. Her journey from a young survivor to a vocal advocate is a testament to the resilience of the human spirit. Through her advocacy, Antoinette inspires others to seek forgiveness and build a world where compassion triumphs over hatred.



THE STRUGGLE IN GAZA

Maram Humaid always believed in the power of storytelling. Growing up in Gaza, she witnessed the struggles and resilience of her community firsthand. With a passion for making a difference, she dedicated herself to learning three languages, dreaming of one day using her voice to shine a light on those in need.

Maram's journey as a journalist began with a deep commitment to her community. She honed her skills, becoming an experienced news writer and storyteller, eventually joining Al Jazeera Media Network in Qatar. There, she consistently covers stories of people in Gaza, highlighting their need for treatment, food, and support amid ongoing conflict.

Maram Humaid's story is one of determination and compassion. She uses her voice to amplify the stories of the voiceless, shedding light on her people's struggles and strength. Her journey inspires others to believe in the power of their voices, reminding us all that storytelling can be a force for profound change.



SCARS OF CONFLICT

Lejla Damon always knew she was different. Born under the darkest circumstances, her birth mother, a Bosnian Muslim, was raped in a concentration camp during the Bosnian Genocide. At just nine days old, Lejla was smuggled out of Bosnia by her adoptive parents and brought to the UK. Growing up, she struggled with her complex identity and fitting in with her British classmates.

As a child of war's sexualized violence, Lejla carries a legacy of pain but also a burning passion for justice. This unique history drives her powerful advocacy against sexualized violence as a weapon of war, which she sees as a deliberate strategy to destroy communities and act as an instrument of genocide.

Lejla has transformed her pain into a platform for advocacy. She shares her story to fight against violence and highlight the horrors of sexualized violence in conflict. Her tireless efforts have earned her numerous accolades, including the prestigious Point of Light award, recognizing her significant contribution to raising awareness and fostering change.

In her role with the Youth Engagement Panel for War Child, Lejla provides invaluable perspectives as someone born out of conflict, shaping the organization's mission to support children affected by war. She also advocates for "Remembering Srebrenica," a UK-based organization dedicated to commemorating the 1995 Bosnian Genocide and combating discrimination, hatred, and extremism.

Lejla's journey from a survivor of unspeakable violence to a beacon of hope and resilience is profoundly inspiring. Her story demonstrates the strength of the human spirit and the power of advocacy. Through her unwavering dedication, Lejla Damon continues to shine a light on the impact of sexualized violence in war, inspiring others to fight for a world where such atrocities are no longer tolerated.



FIRST THEY KILLED MY FATHER

Had you met Loung Ung 40 years ago, you would have seen a young Cambodian girl living on the streets, scavenging from garbage cans, and seeking safe hiding places to sleep. She survived the brutal Khmer Rouge regime by constantly moving until finding refuge in an orphanage, where she was trained to become a child soldier.

Despite the unimaginable horrors, Loung transformed her pain into a force for good. Witnessing the devastation of her homeland, where 2.7 million bombs were dropped, she became determined to prevent such atrocities from happening again.

Loung Ung emerged as an influential human rights activist, author, and public speaker. From 1997 to 2003, she served as the national spokesperson for the Campaign for a Landmine-Free World, advocating tirelessly for the eradication of landmines. Her memoir, "First They Killed My Father: A Daughter of Cambodia Remembers," published in 2000, has been translated into nine languages and published in twelve countries, sharing her story globally.

In 2013, Loung expanded her activism into screenwriting, earning numerous nominations and awards, further amplifying her message. Her efforts have not gone unnoticed; the World Economic Forum named her one of the "100 Global Youth Leaders of Tomorrow," recognizing her significant contributions to human rights.

Loung Ung's journey from a war-torn child to a beacon of hope and advocacy highlights the resilience of the human spirit. Her story inspires us to believe in the power of transformation and the impact one person can have on the world. Through her unwavering dedication, Loung continues to fight for a world free of violence, advocating for compassion and understanding.



THE POWER OF FORGIVENESS

Award-winning author, broadcaster, and journalist Marina Cantacuzino felt a deep calling to effect real change in the world. Driven by a profound desire to make a positive impact, Marina used her platform to champion the transformative power of forgiveness.

In the wake of the 2003 invasion of Iraq, Marina was struck by the pervasive need for forgiveness in a world ravaged by conflict and vengeance. Frustrated by the endless cycle of violence, she decided to channel her feelings into something constructive. This led to the creation of the groundbreaking exhibition, “The F Word: Stories of Forgiveness.” The exhibition showcased powerful narratives of victims who chose forgiveness over retaliation, reaching an audience of 6,000 people in just ten days and touching the lives of 30 million more online. Through these stories, Marina shifted the global perspective on conflict, illustrating that forgiveness can lead to healing and peace.

Building on the success of her exhibitions, Marina founded The Forgiveness Project. For the past 21 years, she has dedicated herself to spreading the message of forgiveness through numerous books, papers, chapters, and articles. The Forgiveness Project has become a beacon of hope, demonstrating that forgiving can lead to profound personal and societal transformation, even in the face of unimaginable pain.

Marina Cantacuzino’s journey is a testament to the incredible power of storytelling and the human capacity for forgiveness. Her work inspires millions, proving that we can break the cycle of hatred through understanding and compassion and create a more peaceful world, one story at a time.



A LIFELINE OF COMPASSION

The possibility of saving 10,000 children from the Holocaust became a reality because of the courageous activism of British volunteers orchestrating the Kindertransport from Vienna to Britain. One of those saved children was Jennifer Nadel's grandfather. Her life is a testament to the enduring power of compassion and its ability to shape generations.

Jennifer Nadel began in the legal realm, working as a barrister and lawyer. However, her passion for truth and justice led her to journalism, where she made a significant impact working for the BBC, Channel Four News, and ITN. As an award-winning journalist, international speaker, and bestselling author, Jennifer has used her voice to advocate for change. Her book, "WE: A Manifesto for Women Everywhere," co-written with Gillian Anderson, became a Sunday Times Bestseller, offering a roadmap for inner transformation and outer change.

Currently, Jennifer leads "Compassion in Politics," a pioneering UK think tank with 100 Members of Parliament as affiliates, striving to infuse political systems with compassion and empathy. In addition to this role, she serves as the Executive Chair of the Global Compassion Coalition, dedicated to building a world where compassion is at the core of all actions and decisions.

Jennifer Nadel's life work underscores the profound impact of compassion in shaping a better world. From her grandfather's survival to her tireless efforts in journalism and activism, she exemplifies how compassionate leadership can drive significant social change. Her story inspires us, reminding us we can create a more just and loving world with empathy and action.

- **Respect and Consideration**

Candidates should show genuine respect for others and a strong desire to contribute to societal betterment.

- **Motivation to Serve**

Candidates should be driven to serve as a Humanitarian Affairs Peace Ambassador for one year, promoting peace and positive change.
