西安市,古稱鎬京、長安、京兆、西京,是中華人民共和國陝西省的省會城市,是中國乃至世界範圍內的文化及旅遊名城,其歷史及人文積澱極為深厚,在海內外知名度較高。其是中國歷史上第一個被稱為京的城市,擁有著 3,100 多年的建城史以及 1,070 餘年的建都史。歷史上曾有包括周、西漢、隋、唐等在內的多個繁榮朝代在此建都,從而令西安見證了中國歷史上開放、外向、尚武、繁榮的頂峰時期圖景,並留下巨量遺存。西安目前有兩項六處世界文化遺產,也是陸上絲綢之路起點城市。西安主城區至今仍保留有完整的明代城牆及城門、護城河及橋、角樓、瓮城、箭樓等設施,在市內及周邊散布著秦始皇陵、漢陽陵、漢長安城遺址、唐大明宮遺址等大量古代文化遺存,具有極高的考古研究價值。

西安是中國國家中心城市之一,絲綢之路經濟帶、新亞歐大陸橋及黃河流域重要城市,關中城市群的經濟、科技、教育、能源、金融、文化、商貿中心,其所屬的閻良區中國重要的航空產業基地。2009年經國務院批准《關中—天水經濟區發展規劃》,提出將西安建設成為國家重要的科技研發中心、區域性商貿、物流、會展中心、區域性金融中心、國際一流旅遊目的地以及全國重要的高新技術產業和先進製造業基地,著力打造西安國際化大都市。
