Poetic Microscope and Colors: from inner self to outer worlds

In April, two exhibitions - <u>Poetic Microscope</u> and <u>Colors: from inner self to outer worlds</u>, were launched to wrap up the annual theme 'Post-pandemic?' of the Cultural Literacy Programme. In Poetic Microscope, 48 colourful cell images taken by Cell Biology students were displayed at Li Promenade. Nearly 350 visitors have voted for their favourite image. In Colors: from inner self to outer worlds, 10 interactive artworks made by 46 Arts Tech students were exhibited at the iCafe and 180 visitors have voted their favourite artwork. CEOs Positive Ageing Learners Programme

Since October 2022, 75 elderly and students from CEOs Positive Ageing Learners Programme have formed Buddy Teams to identify the needs of over 90 frail elderly in the HKBU neighbourhood and propose creative solutions on improving their quality of life. Over 50 home improvement requests were accommodated and 170 thematic care packs were delivered. The Buddy Teams explored positive ageing through service trainings, arts, crafts workshops and local tours, with 1,000 service hours accumulated in this intergenerational community engagement projects in six months. HKBU was honoured to have Dr. Hon Hoey Simon LEE, MH, JP, member of the 7th Legislative Council of the HKSAR as the Keynote Speaker of the <u>HKBU High Table</u> <u>Dinner</u>. Dr. Lee introduced the future development and national strategy of the Greater Bay Area in his keynote speech, which broadened students' understanding of the opportunities that lie ahead.
