

Service Leadership



Students enrolled in <u>GCAP 3067 Path to</u> <u>Service Leadership in Health Services</u> have successfully conducted three care services to 14 elders during the course. At the first encounter, our students interviewed the elderly to know more about their needs and livelihood, while in the second meeting, our students applied their learning and performed Tuina on the elders. In the final service, a series of tailored activities were designed by our students to create a positive experience for the elderly in the postpandemic era.
